<b>Community Accountability</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Operationally refining community given multiple, competing accountabilities of partner organizations</li> <li>Measuring impact of partnership activities on community health status</li> <li>Determining who is accountable (and how) given fluctuating, ill-defined boundaries</li> <li>Coping with limitations of conventional governance models vis-à-vis community involvement in partnership governance</li> <li>Overcoming socioeconomic and cultural barriers that limit community involvement</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Define community as intersection of accountabilities</li> <li>Define community as sum of accountabilities</li> <li>Focus on behavioral measures</li> <li>Focus on intermediate outcomes</li> <li>Perform "hat-checks" before sharing information</li> <li>Work with/through existing local community structures</li> <li>Create multiple opportunities for community voice in governance</li> <li>Build feelings of community ownership</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Concentrates partner organization resources</li> <li>Disperses partner organization resources</li> <li>May lead to means-ends reversal</li> <li>May lead to insufficient attention to some dimensions of CCN vision</li> <li>Requires significant levels of trust and compartmentalization</li> <li>May lower partnership's visibility in community</li> <li>May result in inefficient, unwieldy governance structure</li> <li>Requires significant emotional/behavioral shift and new skills</li> </ul>
