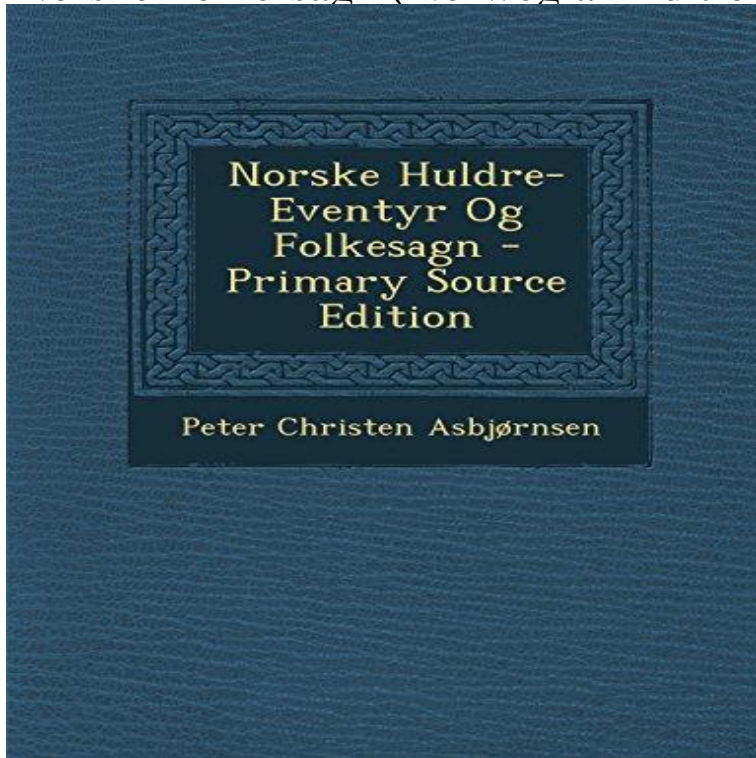


## Norske Folke-sagn (Norwegian Edition)



Asbjørnsen and Moe's *Norske folkeeventyr* 5th edition, *Norwegian Folktales* (Norwegian: *Norske Folkeeventyr*) is a collection of Norwegian folktales collected and published by Peter Christen Asbjørnsen and Jørgen Moe. The first complete edition appeared in 1845 with the title *Eventyr og Folkesagn* (Norwegian Huldre Tales and Folk Legends) which he published.
